<p>Prevention Research Center Products</p>	<p>Y2TEC Y2TEC is a tech-based mental health intervention designed for youth living with HIV.</p> <p>E2i E2i was a four-year project where 11 evidence-informed effective interventions were tested in Ryan White HIV/AIDS Program-funded care settings and evaluated by PRC faculty and staff.
