Dr. Sevelius recently completed a CAPS Innovative Grant project focused on **transgender men who have sex with non-transgender men**. "Because very little data are available on the HIV prevention needs of transgender men, and virtually no information is available regarding transmen who have sex with non-trans men, I felt it was particularly important for the results of this study to reach as many people from as much of a variety of audiences," Said Dr. Sevelius. Examples include:

- Dr. Sevelius returned to Gender Odyssey, a transgender men's conference where she had recruited many participants the year before. In collaboration with a queer-identified transgender man, she reported her findings back to participants.
- Dr. Sevelius used this study as well as other research findings to produce the CAPS HIV Prevention Fact Sheet "What are transgender men's HIV prevention needs?" in collaboration with Ayden Scheim and Broden Giambrone of the Gay/Bi/Queer Trans Men's Working Group, Ontario Gay Men's Sexual Health Alliance. - Dr. Sevelius published in a special transgender issue of the Journal of the Association of Nurses in AIDS Care: "There's no pamphlet for the kind of sex I have": HIV-related risk factors and protective behaviors among transgender men who have sex with non-transgender men.
